The Reading of the Law

Westminster Shorter Catechism, 42–44

Leader: *What is the sum of the Ten Commandments?*

Unison: The sum of the Ten Commandments is, to love the Lord our God with all our heart, with all our soul, with all our strength, and with all our mind; and our neighbor as ourselves.

Leader: *What is the preface to the Ten Commandments?*

Unison: The preface to the Ten Commandments is in these words, “I am the LORD your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery.”

Leader: *What does the preface to the Ten Commandments teach us?*

Unison: The preface to the Ten Commandments teaches us, that because God is the Lord, and our God, and Redeemer, therefore we are bound to keep all his commandments.

The Call to Confession

Romans 7:14–15, 24–25

Leader: *We know that the law is spiritual, but I am of the flesh, sold under sin. For I do not understand my own actions. For I do not do what I want, but I do the very thing I hate.*

Wretched man that I am! Who will deliver me from this body of death? Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ our Lord! So then, I myself serve the law of God with my mind, but with my flesh I serve the law of sin.

The Corporate Prayer of Confession

Unison: Praise to you our Rescuer and our Redeemer. You brought us out of bondage through the mighty and finished work of your Son, Jesus Christ. As we consider the surety and perfection of your law, we give thanks that you gave your law on Sinai to an already rescued and delivered people. Keep us from the temptation to believe that we are delivered based on our keeping of the law. Instead, make us secure in your gracious work that now sets us free to keep your law as the way of wisdom and life. May we live by faith in this truth, “For freedom Christ has set us free.” Together, help us stand firm and no longer submit to a yoke of slavery. In the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Amen.

Romans 8:1–4

Leader: *There is therefore now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. For the law of the Spirit of life has set you free in Christ Jesus from the law of sin and death.
